### Treatment of Metastic Osteosarcoma

New clinical trials have commenced at five Veterinary Oncology Specialist Centres within Australia for the trial of a drug to inhibit the spread of bone cancer. The drug Auranofin has been tested in a mouse model with results showing a significant reduction in the spread of osteosarcoma to the lungs without any side effects. It is hoped that similar results in the reduction of metastasis will be found with dogs.

Auranofin also has the potential for the prevention and treatment of osteosarcoma in humans as well as dogs. Human hospitals are also participating in this study and are listed on the information sheet.

The drug Auranofin will be free but there will be costs that owners will need to pay for themselves. These other costs include those for monitoring the osteosarcoma such as blood tests, xrays and any other testing that the oncologist recommends. Details of the expected cost will be provided when you contact the centres participating in the

A chemotherapy trial for dogs with newly diagnosed lymphoma. The diagnosis of lymphoma and staging needs to be done before the dogs enter the trial, but those services can be completed after referral to the Animal Referral Hospital if needed.

The study pays for chemotherapy, administration fee, supportive care medications, and follow-up blood tests for the first cycle of chemotherapy. The dogs can then go on to standard chemotherapy of the owner's choice (and at the owners expense)
